Information Overview

Upon your arrival at Addenbrooke's you will be assigned an Educational Supervisor. You must arrange to meet your Supervisor within three weeks of your arrival for an induction meeting.

You must have met your Educational Supervisor by Friday 21st August 2015.

Your Clinical Supervisor will be the person that you will work under when you start your rotation at Addenbrooke's Hospital. The Clinical Supervisor will change with every rotation depending on the speciality that you rotate into. In most cases your Educational Supervisor will also be your Clinical Supervisor for your first rotation, although this is not always the case.

Additional shadowing sessions

You are encouraged to do additional shadowing sessions before you start as a FY1 on Wednesday 5th August. You will however have to organise this independently with the Foundation Doctor or Doctors you are shadowing.

You cannot work past 22:00, before you begin work on Wednesday 5th August 2015.

Friday Teaching Programme

We provide a formal Foundation Year One teaching programme, which runs every Friday and is mandatory. A minimum of 70% attendance is required by Health Education East of England (HEEoE). If for any reason you are unable to attend a session you must inform the Foundation Programme administrator before the session (unless you have exceptional circumstances). Your attendance at Friday teaching is recorded and used in your end of year sign off.

The programme and venue is always up to date on WikiFy.

WikiFY

WikiFY forms part of the Addenbrooke's induction programme and is a way of recording all the information that your predecessors wish they'd known before they started their rotations four months ago. It is aimed at FY1s and FY2s, and it should help you feel more prepared and comfortable during your first few shifts here at Addenbrooke's. You will be required to make at least one edit to a page in order to be signed off by your Clinical Supervisor.

Courses in FY1

ALS Course (Advanced Life Support)

The ALS Course is a mandatory course which you are required to complete during your FY1 year.

The course takes place at Madingley Hall, Cambridge. The dates of the courses for 2015 -2016 are:

- 16th & 17th November 2015
- 10th & 11th March 2016
- 2nd June 2016 (eALS)
- 3rd June 2016 (eALS)

(Please note the eALS courses are equivalent to the 2 day course)

You will need to ensure that you have approval to leave the wards. If you have any problems with attending your course then please contact Emma as soon as possible.

Simulation Days

You are offered the opportunity to attend a Simulation day whilst here as an FY1. This takes place in the Simulation Centre at Addenbrooke's Hospital.

This is an excellent opportunity for 'hands on' experience in the treatment and management of critically ill patients through simulation scenarios using the simulation manikins.

The dates for 2015-2016 are:

- 2nd October 2015
- 11th February 2016
- 9th June 2016

Places are limited to 8 trainees and confirmation of your place will only be made once you are able to confirm your clinical commitments have been covered.
